Physical Theatre Final Assessment Piece Outline

Rehearsal Process:

- Each lesson will be focused on a new physical theatre skill. We will workshop a skill throughout the lesson, in order to your performance skill and creativity.
- For your final performance, you will showcase a wide range of Physical Theatre skills. You will need to plan, create and rehearse the piece ready to perform to the rest of the class.
- Students will be put in groups of around 4-6 people.
- · You will also be given a planning grid, where you can plan and organise your scene ideas before rehearsing. This can be found in your drama book.
- Each group will also be expected to find the sound effects or music for your final piece, as there should be no dialogue throughout your final physical theatre performance.
- Students are encouraged to organise and arrange a rehearsal outside of lesson time, this will be classed as homework. This will also be a good time to rehearse your piece with the sound.

Performance:

- · Once fully finished and rehearsed, each group will then performed their physical theatre pieces to the rest of the class.
- This performance will be recorded, so students can watch it back and evaluate their own work.

Evaluation:

- Each student will need to watch their piece back and make feedback notes on their performance and of another group.
- Each student will discuss what went well and what they could improve on for next time.
 Once each student has shared their feedback, they will then need to write up their notes into full sentences, in order to complete writing up their evaluation.
