Dear Parent/Carer,

Opportunity to visit Uganda: February Half Term

Prior to 2020, The Weald had built a strong bond with the staff and students at Namilyango College, our partner school situated just outside Uganda's capital, Kampala. Between 2015-2020, Year 11 students visited Namilyango College each February as part of an exchange partnership. The project originated from the London 2012 Olympic Legacy project when interested British schools were paired with Commonwealth countries and schools around the world.

I am delighted to announce that we will be running this trip again in partnership with Midhurst Rother College and we will be sending approximately 10 students from each school (and 2 staff members) to visit Uganda during the February half term 2025.

Students will largely be based in and around Namilyango College, a vast and impressive site which includes its own functioning farm, in order to get a real sense of what life is like for a young person in education in Uganda. There will be opportunities to visit the local area, including a day trip to Jinga and the 'source of the Nile', as well as the chance to support children in local primary schools: both in the classroom and through sports leadership. An important part of the visit over the last few years has been the opportunity to work with some of Uganda's most deprived children through 'Hands for Hope', an organisation with which The Weald has developed close links.

The trip is challenging and rewarding on a personal and an educational level. Weald students should be prepared to take and deliver presentations on life in the UK to Namilyango students as well as working on a number of cross-curricular projects in the school. Students will be accommodated on the school site, eat with Ugandan students and attend a number of classes alongside their other activities. The cost of the whole trip is likely to be around £1,200.00 - £1,500.00, dependent on securing flight costs. In addition to sending our students to Uganda, we have made a commitment to welcoming Ugandan students at the Weald within the next 18 months. The cost of the 2025 trip will include a contribution towards the cost of a flight for one Ugandan member of school staff to come to the UK.

A major attraction for The Weald in getting involved in this project is the potential to host a group of Ugandan students. The students work incredibly hard at the Ugandan school, one of the highest- performing schools in the country. In a school like The Weald, which is less ethnically diverse than many schools in the UK, we are keen to welcome and host

a group of students from another continent, whose lifestyle and life experiences are very different from our own students.
