### Enrichment Day - Thursday 19 March 2026

Our second enrichment day of the academic year is **Thursday 19 March**, and we are delighted to be able to offer a day packed full of opportunities for all our students.

There are a large number of in school activities on offer, as well as day trips. For those activities that take place within the normal school day, parents are not obliged to make a contribution, however, the cost of travel, activities and meals fall outside of the normal day for trips. It is probable that if insufficient monies are received, the trip will have to be cancelled.

If a situation occurs where a trip becomes oversubscribed, a lottery system will be used to select students fairly.

#### **Y12 - In school activity**

If your child is not on a trip, they will attend school as normal, no home study is granted on an Enrichment Day.

- **Core Maths & A Level Maths - in school (Free of charge)**

This day is designed to deepen students' understanding of numbers in Real World contexts and sessions are suitable for both A Level Maths and Core Maths students.

We are hoping to organise 2 workshops with a speaker from [Think Maths](#) to complement sessions run by the maths department.

- **Opportunity & Community activities** - focused on post-18 options and life skills including "How to prepare for and interview well" and "University Life - a post 18 option". Business students will be invited to assist with the Y9 Business & Enterprise Day running in school.

#### **Y13 - In school activity**

If your child is not on a trip, they will attend school as normal, no home study is granted on an Enrichment Day. Y13 can choose from either the Y12 opportunity and community activities as outlined above OR joining a silent study space in school.

#### **Off site trips:**

- **Computer Science Museum £25.50**

The London Science Museum brings abstract concepts to life through real-world applications. Its computing and information galleries showcase the history of computers, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, and data processing, helping students see how theoretical ideas translate into practical systems. Interactive exhibits also encourage problem-solving and critical thinking, reinforcing skills central to Computer Science while inspiring students by showing the impact of technology on society, industry, and future innovation.

- **Royal Courts of Justice £42.50 - (Priority will be given to A-Level Criminology and Sociology students)**

The Royal Courts of Justice are the home of the Supreme Court and Court of Appeals for England

and Wales. These are the highest courts in the land and where the most high profile cases are heard. This is relevant to your Unit 3 and Unit 4 Criminology work and will give you a good understanding of how the legal system works in England and Wales.

- **British Museum - £23.00**

The British Museum day will provide students with an invaluable opportunity to experience artefacts from a wide range of cultures. The work produced from this day will provide valuable research for current projects and contextual study for those studying A Level Ceramics.

- **Travel & Tourism - Brighton - £21.50** - for Y12 Travel and Tourism students only. A trip Brighton which complements your studies.

- **Geography Field Trip - Horsham** - this is only open to the Y12 Geography students and is a compulsory trip. Details will be sent directly to those students who must attend.


