Year 7 Assessment Information - 27 January 2025 - 3 February 2025

I am writing ahead of the Year 7 assessments, which will take place in the fortnight beginning 27 January 2025. These assessments will take place in class. Your child will be informed by their teachers when this assessment will take place.

These assessments will check learning from across Key Stage 3 and will allow your child to demonstrate the progress they are making in the curriculum. We will share the results of these assessments, in the form of a %, in their next tracking report. You will have the opportunity to discuss these assessments with your child's teachers at Parents' and Carers' Evening on the 2 and 3 April 2025. Year 7 has a further assessment period beginning 12 May 2025.

Below is a summary of the topic/s your child will be assessed on for each subject, suggested revision timings, revision resources and tasks. Your child's teachers will be setting them homework tasks in the weeks leading up to the assessment to support their preparation. I hope you find this helpful in supporting your child.
