
I am writing ahead of the Year 7 assessments, which will take place in the fortnight beginning 18 May 2026 (with half term inbetween). These assessments will take place in class and your child will be informed by their teachers when this assessment will take place.

These assessments will check learning from across Key Stage 3 so far and will allow your child to demonstrate the progress they are making in the curriculum. We will share the results of these assessments (in the form of a percentage) in their next tracking report.
