Year 7 Assessment Information - Summer Term 2024

I am writing ahead of the Year 7 assessments, which will take place over a two week period, Monday 20 May to Friday 24 May and Monday 3 June to Friday 7 June 2024. These assessments will take place in class. Your child's teachers will inform them of when their assessment for each subject will take place. This date will also be on Bromcom/MCAS (My Child At School). Please contact subject teachers if you are unable to find this information.

These assessments will check learning from across Year 7 so far and will allow your child to demonstrate the progress they are making in the curriculum. We will share the results of these assessments (in the form of a % and green/yellow progress indicators) in their next tracking report (Tracking 3). This will be sent to parents in late June.

Below is a summary of the topic/s your child will be assessed on in each subject, suggested revision timings, revision resources and tasks. I hope you find this helpful in supporting your child's preparation. In addition to this, all homework set from now until the assessment fortnight will be RED review (a set of revision techniques which are effective. These are retrieval practice, elaboration and dual coding).
