 Tate Modern - £31.00 - A chance to see the large permanent collection and also to visit the temporary exhibition 'Electric Dreams', an exhibition that explores art and technology before the internet. Here you will enter a dreamscape of machines, movement and installations that play with your perception. There will also be opportunities to photograph/draw from the fantastic London skyline along the southbank to feed into the Y10 Art Environments project, for students who take this GCSE.

Priority will be given to GCSE Art students, however this trip is open to all Y10 students who would like to visit this exciting gallery.

 Butlin's PlayXperience - £43.50 - A business based activity day including the financials of the Play Experience building with a PX leader, free time on Laser Tag, Tech Putt, Digi Darts, Shuffleboard, Glow Pong, Neo Games and Batting Cage

• Brain Rest Day (Out of Bounds) - £40.00 - This exciting day will consist of an array of in and outdoor activities to suit everyone, and great for supporting physical and mental health, building confidence and team-building.

The Big Debate - Religious and political representatives from the local area
are invited to discuss some contemporary issues. They will share their views
on the questions that our Sixth Formers have voted on in advance. It is a
chance to see how the beliefs of religious and political representatives from
various backgrounds impact their views on some of the issues that we face as
a society.

P5-6, students will be able to engage with a variety of life skill sessions including topics such as; taxes, mortgages, savings, insurance etc.

Off-site trips:

- Wakehurst £19.50 Wakehurst Place is the home of the Millennium Seed Bank, which is one of the largest ex situ conservation seed banks in the world. It is an example that is specifically mentioned in the Biology A-level syllabus and is a working site. Students will be able to walk around the seed vaults as well as see the work carried out by the lab technicians.
- Parliament trip £10.00 The trip to Parliament is a unique opportunity to see how our democracy in the UK works and the historic Palace of Westminster where it takes place. This trip is open to all Y12 students, however as it ties to the Criminology course with further links to the Sociology and History courses, these students will get priority.
- Geography Field Trip Horsham this is only open to the Y12 Geography students and is a compulsory trip. Details have been sent directly to those students who must attend.
