## Year 8 Assessment Information - March 2024

I am writing ahead of the Year 8 assessments, which will take place over a two week period, Monday 6 May to Friday 17 May 2024. These assessments will take place in class, except English, Maths and Science which will take place in venues. Your child's teachers will inform them of when their assessment for each subject will take place. This date will also be on Bromcom.

These assessments are the final assessments of KS3 and will cover content from both Year 7 and Year 8. We will share the results of these assessments in the form of a % in their final Year 8 tracking report (tracking 3). The overall % informs the progress colour for each subject: green for making progress and yellow for making insufficient progress. Students will also be given an attainment grade to show how far students have 'mastered' the Key Stage Three Curriculum. Each subject has outlined a criteria for students to be 'ready to progress' after Key Stage 3. Students will be graded as either beyond the 'ready' to progress' criteria, met the 'ready' to progress' criteria or working towards the 'ready' to progress' criteria. It is possible that a student may have made progress (green) across Key Stage Three from their starting point even though they are still 'working towards' the 'ready to progress' criteria and be continuing study of that subject at GCSE. Tracking 3 will be shared with parents in June alongside further guidance on the above.

Below is a summary of the topic/s your child will be assessed on in each subject, suggested revision timings, revision resources and tasks. I hope you find this helpful in supporting your child's preparation. In addition to this, all homework set from now until the assessment fortnight will be RED review with knowledge organisers.

I will be running two open revision sessions for Year 8 students in the lead up to their assessments. The focus of these sessions will be on how to revise effectively (using RED review techniques). They will take place afterschool on Tuesday 23 April and Tuesday 30 April in T8 (3.15-4.15pm).

- ✤ 4 x 15 minute slots with 5 minute breaks in between
- ✤ 2 x 30 minute slots with a 10 minute break in between
- Please do not revise for longer than 1.5 hours for each subject

#### For your assessments, please bring:

- PRPRC: 2 pens, 2 pencils, ruler, rubber and scientific calculator
- Protractor and a ruler with cm and mm graduations are also required for Maths
