#### Year 9 Assessment Information - March 2025

I am writing ahead of the Year 9 formal assessments, which will take place over a two week period, Monday 3 March to Friday 14 March 2025. These assessments will take place in class. Your child will be informed by their class teachers when each assessment will take place during these weeks. Each date will also be on Bromcom.

These assessments will check learning from across Key Stage 4 and will allow your child to demonstrate the progress they are making in the curriculum. We will share the results of these assessments, in the form of a %, in their tracking 2 report. The overall % informs the progress colour for each subject: green for making progress and yellow for making insufficient progress.

Below is a summary of the topic/s your child will be assessed on in each subject, suggested revision timings, revision resources and tasks. All homework set from now until the assessment fortnight will be RED revision homework. Students should be aiming to revise for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours per day (including their homework).

I will be running two open revision sessions for Year 9 students in the lead up to their assessments. They will take place afterschool on Wednesday 26 February and Thursday 27 February in A28 (3.15-4.15pm).

- ❖ 3 x 30 minute slots with a 10 minute break in between
- Revision homework set by your teachers should be included in your 1 ½ hours of revision per day
- Please do not revise for longer than 2 hours per day

# Week 1 Exams: Monday 3rd March - Friday 7th March 2025

English	Students will sit two papers. One is Language-focused and the other is Literature-focused, assessing all units they have studied so far this year. Both will include GCSE style questions.  The Language paper will feature 2 reading questions based on an unseen fiction text and will examine students' ability to pick out quotations and analyse the use of language and structure. There will also be a writing question where students can choose one of two questions to demonstrate their creative writing skills.  The Literature paper will examine students' ability to analyse given extracts using their knowledge of the whole of texts. They will be asked to write about how a theme from '29 Locks' is presented in a given extract and in the rest of the novel. This will require students to learn quotations from the text.
