November:

- Practising the design section
- Fibres, natural and synthetic
- Regenerated fibres and fabrics
- Combining fibres, e.g. cotton and polyester

December: (over christmas break)

- Fabric construction, plain weave, twill weave, sateen weave, knit, non-woven
- New fabrics, smart and modern fabrics

<u>January:</u>

- Dyeing and printing, in school and in a factory Types of decoration, appliqué, free machine embroidery etc.
- Fastenings and components

February:

- Fabric finishes, flame retardant, crease resistant
- Environmental issues, 6R, social, moral, Fair trade etc.

March:

- Health and Safety, consumer rights and labelling
- Manufacturing

April:

- Quality assurance during manufacture, checking fabric, seams etc
- Review of; construction techniques, seams, hems, darts, seam finishes such as overlocking ICT, CAD/CAM

May: General revision/preparation including:

- Label design in detail, construction techniques, fabrics including smart and modern fabrics, techniques, and components
- You might be asked to design a bag, a cushion, a toy, a garment so be prepared
- Read the time allowance on the paper for each question and don't spend too long on each question.
- Explain your answers. Don't just make a statement
- Read the guestions carefully. You will not be asked the same thing twice
- Remember to bring drawing equipment and colouring crayons. If you forget come and get some from the Textiles room.
- Use your common sense. Don't panic. Do the best you can. You can do this.
